Principal's Message

We have had a very busy start to this school year and are in full swing once again, with many programs starting up for our students (Choir, Student Council, Sports, etc.) Thank you to all of our volunteers!

During this past week we have had an addition to our teaching staff. We would like to take this opportunity to welcome to our school Mme. Abbott, who is teaching opposite Mme. Dominique in Grade 5 and will be with us on Thursdays and Fridays.

At the start of any school year, teachers regularly employ diagnostic assessments in reading, writing and mathematics. These assessments are meant to determine the relative strengths and challenges for our students, so that we may begin to build and implement support plans and extension projects. This year, Ecole Hammond Bay will be working with the NLPS Reading Assessments. These assessments have been designed by teachers of our district and are available in both English and French. Our students will be assessed primarily in the French reading and comprehension skills. Grades 1 through 7 will be assessed in this first term, whereas Kindergarten will be completed in January once they have a working knowledge of the French language. The results of these assessments are to inform our instruction and help us plan the next steps in our school goals: Literacy and Numeracy. They will not be used as part of a summative grade on end of term report cards.

The Board of Education of Nanaimo-Ladysmith Public Schools is currently conducting consultation meetings at various locations across the district with regards to the New Facilities Plan. Your input is valued and we would encourage parents and guardians to attend. Closer to home, the City of Nanaimo will be replacing pipes along and across Morningside Drive this fall. This may impact access and parking to our school. As more information becomes available, families will be notified by the school via email. Our communication system to you (Parent Notification emails) will be changing in the next few weeks, as the new Ministry of Education's MyEdBC computer system becomes fully functional. We hope to make this switch seamlessly. Thank you for your patience.

To receive our monthly newsletters electronically and/or receive information regarding school fundraising activities and community events, please visit our school website and subscribe. You can unsubscribe at any time.

If you have not yet returned to your child's teacher the Student Verification Form, please do so as soon as possible. It is important for us to have current phone numbers to reach you in case your child is sick or has an accident. If you change your phone numbers throughout the year, please let the office know immediately, so we can keep your child's contact information up to date.

Parents/guardians wishing to volunteer in our school or participating in our extra-curricular activities must complete a Criminal Record Check. The link to the Online Criminal Record Check is available on our school website on the "Parents Page". Scroll down to the "School Documents" section to find the process instructions and the live link. Please do not forget to send me your full name and birth date once you have completed the online form. I forward your information to the District office where they are maintaining a master list per The RCMP sends your clearance school. document to them, and then in turn they inform the schools. It is a monumental task to connect volunteer to school if we do not have a thread to follow (ie. your email to me indicating your information). If you completed the online form and are not sure if you have been cleared, you can verify with the RCMP or the school, or ask your child's classroom teacher.

During the month of September, we discussed behavior expectations with our students. We are encouraging our students to be friendly, positive and helpful to each other, to participate in various activities, and to help build our school community. We also discussed, with our intermediate students, exclusion and bullying in the context of online gaming and social media. Thank you to our police liaison officer, Constable Wilson for facilitating these important discussions. We would encourage families to continue these conversations, which are needed to keep our children safe online.

Parking Lot Safety Concerns

We recognize that our parking lot is crowded and difficult to navigate during our peak hours (morning and afternoon),



however to keep everyone, especially our students safe, please be reminded that:

- the speed limit should be very slow. Children do not always look before they step out into the traffic.
- that there is no long term stopping in the paved round-about area at the top of the parking lot. Only vehicles with a designated handicap sign in their window and daycare buses are allowed to stop in this area. Drop off and pick up in this area is still permissible, however we ask that you do not park and wait.
- The lower round-about is for drive through only. Please do not park in this area.
- If you are choosing to park in the school parking lot, please do not block our entrance and exit. We have had a number of complaints of cars being double parked, making it difficult for families to leave, and others to enter.
- The traffic flows only one way entry to the right. We have noticed a number of vehicles coming into the parking lot using the left side.

We encourage parents to use other parking areas which are available around the school site: along Morningside, Neck Point Park and Shores Drive to facilitate the large amount of traffic through our parking lot.

The Board of Education is currently consulting parents, students and the public about its Facilities Plan Update. During the next several weeks, the Board will be holding public forums to discuss the proposals in the plan. The format of these forums has been designed to encourage dialogue and discussion. At each meeting, there will be a short introductory session, a presentation; a facilitator-led discussion group on topics of importance to each community; and a short closing session.

The meeting to discuss the proposed relocation of French Immersion in the district will be held on Tuesday, October 27 at Nanaimo District Secondary School, beginning at 7 p.m.
