Principal's Message

We have had a very busy start to this school year and are in full swing once again, with many programs starting up for our students. Thank you to all of our volunteers!

PAC has requested that the monthly newsletter be distributed to parents during the first week of every month, so parents are reminded of activities coming up that month at the school and in the community. Please note that October and November newsletters have been combined and therefore only one newsletter will be distributed. Friday Reminders will continue to be distributed via email every Friday to all parents with a list of events coming up the following week. Please also visit the school's website for the latest information about the school/district and our calendar of events.

At the start of any school year, teachers regularly employ diagnostic assessments in reading, writing and mathematics. These assessments are meant to determine the relative strengths and challenges for our students, so that we may begin to build and implement support plans and extension projects. This year, Ecole Hammond Bay will be working with the ALPIN and NLPS Reading Assessments. These assessments have been designed by teachers of our district and are available in both English and French. Grades 1-7 students will be assessed throughout October, and Kindergarten will be completed in January once they have a working knowledge of the French language. The results of these assessments are to inform our instruction and help us plan the next steps in our school goals. Teachers may be discussing the results of these assessments with parents at the Parent Teacher Interviews.

This year we tried a new system for parents to book appointments for Parent Teacher Interviews. We hope that you have found it easy and more convenient. Mr. Mark and I would welcome any feedback which you might have regarding using this system in the future. Please do not hesitate to contact us at the school.

We also have a new school notification system. Parents no longer are required to subscribe to our new system. Notifications will be sent directly to the emails indicated on the Student

Verification forms. We are always looking for feedback, and would welcome any comments about our new system.

The gym construction is coming along. You will have noticed that the exterior walls and roof are on. The interior is now being wired and insulated. We are on track, barring any unforeseen delays, to have all construction completed by the end of November.

Football Season is coming to a close. Our Bantam Girls have been doing well this season and will be moving into the playoffs. We wish them the best of luck! Thank you to Mr. Heringa and Mme. Raduta for coaching and sponsoring the team.

It is important for us to have current phone numbers to reach you in case your child is sick or has an accident. If you change your phone numbers throughout the year, please let the office know immediately, so we can keep your child's contact information up to date.

Parents/guardians wishing to volunteer in our school or participating in our extra-curricular activities must complete a Criminal Record Check. The link to the Online Criminal Record Check is available on our school website on the "Parents Page". In the drop down box, scroll down to "Resources" link to find the process instructions and the live link. Please do not forget to send me your full name and birth date once you have completed the online form. I forward your information to the District office where they are maintaining a master list per The RCMP sends your clearance document to them, and then in turn they inform the schools. It is a monumental task to connect volunteer to school if we do not have a thread to follow (ie. your email to me indicating your information). If you completed the online form and are not sure if you have been cleared, you can verify with the RCMP or the school, or ask your child's classroom teacher.

Parking Lot Safety Concerns

We recognize that our parking lot is crowded and difficult to navigate during our peak hours (morning and afternoon), however to keep everyone, especially our students safe, please be reminded that:

the speed limit should be very slow.
Children do not always look before they step out into the traffic.

- that there is no long term stopping in the paved round-about area at the top of the parking lot. Only vehicles with a designated handicap sign in their window and daycare buses are allowed to stop in this area.
- The lower round-about is for drive through only. *Please do not park in this area.*
- If you are choosing to park in the school parking lot, please do not block our entrance and exit. We have had a number of complaints of cars being double parked, making it difficult for families to leave, and others to enter.
- The traffic flows only one way entry to the right. We have noticed a number of vehicles coming into the parking lot using the left side.

We encourage parents to use other parking areas which are available around the school site: along Morningside, Neck Point Park and Shores Drive to facilitate the large amount of traffic through our parking lot.
