Principal's Message

We have had a very busy start to this school year and are in full swing once again, with many programs starting up for our students. Thank you to all of our volunteers!

At the start of any school year, teachers regularly employ diagnostic assessments in reading, writing and mathematics. These assessments are meant to determine the relative strengths and challenges for our students, so that we may begin to build and implement support plans and extension projects. Once again, Ecole Hammond Bay will be working with the ALPIN and NLPS Reading Assessments. These assessments have been designed by teachers of our district and are available in both English and French. Grades 1-7 students will be assessed throughout October, and Kindergarten will be completed in January once they have a working knowledge of the French language. The results of these assessments are to inform our instruction and help us plan the next steps in our school goals. Teachers may be discussing the results of these assessments with parents at the Parent Teacher Interviews.

Foundation Skills Assessments (FSA) is currently underway in the Grade 4 and 7 classrooms. This is a mandatory assessment from the Ministry of Education, which we complete every year in October. Information gathered from this assessment is used at Ecole Hammond Bay to help design specialized programming and resource allocation, as well as drives our school goal(s).

For the school year we are using the online system for parents to book appointments for Parent Teacher Interviews. We hope that you have found it easy and more convenient. Mme. Payne and I would welcome any feedback. Please do not hesitate to contact us at the school.

It is important for us to have current phone numbers to reach you in case your child is sick or has an accident. If you change your phone numbers throughout the year, please let the office know immediately, so we can keep your child's contact information up to date.

Parents/guardians wishing to volunteer in our school or participating in our extra-curricular

activities must complete a Criminal Record Check. The link to the Online Criminal Record Check is available on our school website on the "Parents Page". In the drop down box, scroll down to "Resources" link to find the process instructions and the live link. Please do not forget to send me your full name and birth date once you have completed the online form. I forward your information to the District office where they are maintaining a master list per The RCMP sends your clearance school. document to them, and then in turn they inform the schools. It is a monumental task to connect volunteer to school if we do not have a thread to follow (ie. your email to me indicating your information). If you completed the online form and are not sure if you have been cleared, you can verify with the RCMP or the school, or ask your child's classroom teacher. Paper based RCMP Criminal Record checks will no longer be accepted.

As part of the curriculum's core competencies, Mme. Payne and I will be hosting STEM challenges for all of the students at Ecole Hammond Bay every second month. challenges allow students to develop creative and critical thinking and communication skills. They work cooperatively in their house team to solve a challenge. During the month of October, the Intermediates were challenged to build the tallest balloon tower and the Primaries were challenged to build the tallest straw tower, with a limited supply of resources. You may see some pictures of our STEM challenges in the School District news (media consents were verified) and/or be in the upcoming Parent Teacher Conferences. The next challenge is coming up in December.

Parking Lot Safety Concerns

We recognize that our parking lot is crowded and difficult to navigate during our peak hours (morning and afternoon), however to keep everyone, especially our students safe, please be reminded that:

- the speed limit should be very slow. Children do not always look before they step out into the traffic.
- that there is no long term stopping in the paved round-about area at the top of the parking lot. Only vehicles with a designated handicap sign in their window and daycare buses are allowed to stop in this area.
- The lower round-about is for drive through only. *Please do not park in this area.*
- If you are choosing to park in the school parking lot, please do not block our entrance and exit. We have had a number of complaints of cars being double parked, making it difficult for families to leave, and others to enter.
- The traffic flows only one way entry to the right. We have noticed a number of vehicles coming into the parking lot using the left side.

We encourage parents to use other parking areas which are available around the school site: along Morningside, Neck Point Park and Shores Drive to facilitate the large amount of traffic through our parking lot.
