Welcome back everyone! We hope that you all had a wonderful and restful holiday, and wish you the very best for the New Year.

Registration for Kindergarten and Academies began on January 8<sup>th</sup>. French Immersion Kindergarten registration will be open until January 31<sup>st</sup>; English Kindergarten until June 15<sup>th</sup> and Academies until March 31<sup>st</sup>.

French Immersion Kindergarten siblings have a space reserved for them if parents complete the online registration form by the closing deadline. Please contact the school office by January 24th, if you have a child coming into Kindergarten in September 2020 and has a sibling currently attending Ecole Hammond Bay. If you have a Grade 7 student continuing on to NDSS French Immersion, the school automatically completes the registration for you. (Please see the section below entitled GRADE 8 NDSS REGRISTRATION). If you are choosing to attend another secondary school in SD68, please complete the online registration form and contact the secondary school of your choice. Online Registration Forms are available at www.sd68.bc.ca under the Registration tab. If you have any questions about registration, please do not hesitate to contact the office at 250-758-5711.

NDSS counselors will be visiting Grade 7s at Ecole Hammond Bay on January 21st to begin the process of Grade 8 course selection. If you are not planning on attending NDSS, please complete the online registration form and contact your secondary school of choice for their course selection options and school tour.

Mid-Year Progress Reports will be coming home to families on February 7th, 2020. The written comments and a sliding scale are the two important components of this document. There will be no letter grades provided on this reporting document. For questions or concerns about your child's learning progression, please speak to the classroom teacher directly.

Hammond Bay will be hosting a EHB Expansion Project Presentation on January 23<sup>rd</sup> at 6:30 pm in the school gym. School District Facilities and the Expansion Project Manager will be presenting the scope of the project. Parents and members of the community will have an opportunity to ask questions.

#### Filming, Photography and Student Privacy

There are a variety of school events, activities or sports games that take place during the year and there is no better way to document these events by taking photos or videos. However, we must still be mindful of our student's privacy.

A parent wishing to film or photograph students and then post these images to a website (i.e. Facebook/Twitter/YouTube/Vimeo) must have signed permission for the students by their parents before posting their image online. To do so without signed permission is a violation of BC privacy legislation.

While the responsibility lies solely with the person taking the photo or video, the district wants to take this opportunity remind all parents and guardians to remain respectful of everyone's privacy.

#### NDSS Grade 8 Registration

Grade 7 students are automatically registered and scheduled at Nanaimo District Secondary for Grade 8, as NDSS is our catchment high school. There is no need to apply to NDSS as this is automatically taken care of for your child.

#### <u>District Policy for School Closures on</u> <u>Snow Days</u>

It is that time of year again, when the school district would like to remind parents about school closure procedures. The most common reasons that schools might be closed are dangerous road conditions due to a heavy snowfall or ice.

If you are wondering if schools are open on a particular day, for the most current updates listen to local radio stations (WAVE 102.3 FM and WOLF 106.9 FM) in the mornings.

We also attempt to put an announcement of any school closure on the school district website, <u>www.sd68.bc.ca</u>, and on Twitter and Facebook, but our ability to do so could be affected by such things as power outages and technical issues. If there is no announcement on the website or social media, please be sure to listen to local radio stations.

We would like to remind parents that it is their right to make the final decision as to whether it is safe for their children to travel to school on any given day. While the district strives to make the best decision possible for students across the district, there may be circumstances in your neighbourhood that lead you to decide to keep your children home, even though schools are open.

#### Snow Toys & Toboggans

It is that time of year again when snow is in the forecast. Sleds and toboggans are welcome at the school for recess activities on the lower hill, but we are asking you to kindly keep snowboards and other snow toys at home. Students will be asked to keep their sleds outside their classrooms and to follow all the rules (which will be broadcasted to students in the morning and recess announcements) to keep everyone safe, while having fun.
